Accompaniment

In musical settings, accompaniment is music added to the melody to enhance it. The melody is richer and fuller when it is accompanied with other music. The accompaniment does not seek to change the melody, but make it better. In the foodie world, accompaniment is other foods added to a single food to make the meal more enjoyable and bring out additional tastes. The dictionary says accompaniment is "something added to something else to make it better".

Accompaniment is a description of the model of engagement we use in Global Missions. Years ago, we as a church and many other churches changed our way of working with indigenous peoples in mission settings from a colonial to an accompaniment model. We moved from telling our mission story in ways to make people like us, to ways of walking along side of people and sharing their life and asking them how we can help make their life and work better. In addition, we also shared with them things we could learn from them. That is accompaniment.

In the bible story of the Road to Emmaus (Luke 24:13-27) Jesus demonstrates accompaniment, or walking with, as he travels the road with the disciples heading home to Emmaus. He walks with them and listens to what concerns them. Then it is in breaking bread that they come to know that it is Jesus. When Jesus talks about neighbors in the Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5:43-48), one of the meanings of "neighbor" is someone we walk the road with. Jesus walked the roads of the Ancient Near East listening to people and the way he helps is enhanced by what he learned by listening to them tell their story.

The church is in a time of change and renewal. Many churches see their communities or neighborhoods in ways that we use to look at mission in foreign countries. There are assumptions made about what people need and what life is like, without ever really getting to know them as neighbors. What if we used the global mission model of accompaniment as a way of reconnecting with our context? How could we be listening to folks, walking with them, and asking what would enhance their lives and ours? When we rate the vitality of our congregation, can there be a component where the community rates how vital the work of the church is to the community? When we brainstorm mission/outreach ideas, could we also gather ideas from the community? Better yet, might be asking the community/neighborhood what projects they and the congregation could work on together?

A sure sign of vitality in a congregation is to work on accompaniment as a way to walk alongside of those who have never been in our buildings. How could walking along side of people in our communities lead us to share an invitation to have Jesus walk along side of others we meet?
