Our 2015 Speaker: **Deacon Keith Fournier** serves as Founder and Chairman of the [Common Good Foundation](#) and the Common Good Alliance. He is a senior writer for [The Stream](#) and was the Editor in Chief at Catholic Online. Though he currently continues to write for Catholic Online, he will soon launch the Common Good Channel where he will focus much of his energy on programming intended to assist viewers in applying their Christian faith to cultural transformation.

Attorney Fournier is a Constitutional and human rights lawyer currently who has practiced law for thirty-five years, focusing on pro-life, pro-marriage and religious liberty causes and concerns. He currently serves as Special Counsel to Liberty Counsel and Chief Counsel to the Common Good Legal Defense Fund. He appeared as co-counsel on several cases before the US Supreme Court.

He is the author of eight books on Christian living and the author of thousands of articles. He has hosted a daily national radio program called “Purpose for Living,” as well as several television series on Christian family and contemporary issues on EWTN (Eternal Word Television Network). He and his wife Laurine have five grown children and seven grandchildren and reside in Virginia.

He was ordained as a Deacon in the Diocese of Richmond, Virginia in 1996. He holds a BA in theology and philosophy from the Franciscan University of Steubenville, a Masters Degree in Marriage and Family Theology from the John Paul II Institute of the Lateran University, a Juris Doctor Law Degree Law from the University of Pittsburgh School of Law and is a PhD student preparing for his comprehensive exams in Moral Theology at the Catholic University.
