Congregation Engagement I have served the fine people of Immanuel Lutheran Church in Jackson for just under five years. Together, we survived the pandemic and have continued to flourish since. We tend to worry less about our financial health (although we were challenged to do that recently and have successfully negotiated that challenge) and we tend to concern ourselves instead about how we can love God and serve our neighbor as Jesus commands us to do. Among many other programs, for example, our Food Pantry provides a significant portion of a week's groceries to up to 300 4-person families (or 1200 people) per week! I have never been associated with a congregation that does outreach so well and am blessed to be among these friends and members of Immanuel. In addition to the ways we reach out, that I haven't mentioned, we have a strong choir and two rich worship experiences per week. We have recently committed to being more active in evangelism by engaging together to see what we can do now to sustain our congregation into the future.
