SYNOD MISSION STATEMENT: We are prayerfully participating in Christ's own work of reconciling the world to God's very self by: renewing congregations, empowering leaders, and strengthening connections.

NORTH/WEST Lower Michigan Synod - Vitality Initiative

A two year intensive renewal/vitality learning community to enhance the 6 vital systems of congregational vitality: Community Engagement, Evangelism, Worship, Faith Formation, Generosity, and Leadership.

Elements:

- congregations will send a team of 3 lay persons and the pastor to 6
 one day events over 2 years (if at all possible one lay person
 should be a youth or young adult)
- events will be held in central location around the synod
- course work will consist of 2 reading assignments between retreats
- each cohort of congregations will be limited to 6
- vitality team will provide congregational coaches
- congregations must:
 - + have a contracted or called pastor
 - + be current with parochial reports to ELCA
 - + be working toward 10% mission support
 - + have a congregational or council vote to commit to the process
 - + submit 2 payments of \$400, one per year to enroll

The remaining costs will be funded by the synod and a generous grant from The Evangelical Lutheran Church - Campaign—Always Being Made New.

First cohort of 7 congregations began in November of 2019. The second group will begin in late Spring of 2020. New trainings will be enrolled each year until every congregation that wants to be trained has completed the course.



ELCA Future Directions 2020



As the ELCA looks ahead to the future, we aspire to have congregations whose faith shines in their relationships with God, each other and their community. Vital congregations experience heightened worship, prayer, study of scripture, and sharing of testimony as they discern the presence and will of God in their midst.

Vital congregations do these three things:



- a. Leadership articulates how God shows up in and through the congregation and its people
- b. The congregation has a clear understanding of God's larger mission and members know their purpose in this time and place
- c. The congregation can articulate that purpose and create a plan for implementation



- a. Relationships among leadership, pastor(s) and staff, and members create a loving community with good communication
- b. People work together respectfully through successes and challenges
- c. There is a sense of ownership and belonging that drives the commitment and engagement in the mission of the church



- a. The congregation opens its doors to welcome the stranger and goes beyond its doors to share the love of Jesus Christ
- Creates and nurtures partnerships within the community to make a positive impact on the strength of the community
